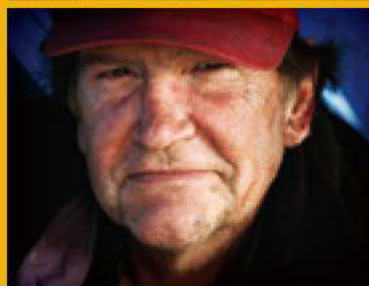


THE ENDING HUNGER, FEEDING HOPE CAMPAIGN WILL ENABLE FOOD LIFELINE TO:

- **Collect millions more pounds of food** that would otherwise go to waste.
- **Efficiently distribute even more food to Western Washington food banks** in order to feed tens of thousands more hungry people.
- **Help 300 food banks, emergency shelters and meal programs** — most of which are understaffed or rely solely on volunteers — to implement innovative new hunger-fighting programs that uniquely serve their own communities.
- **Engage thousands more people as volunteers** who can provide cost-efficient donated labor that saves on administrative and operational expenses.
- **Prevent and ultimately end hunger** by influencing public policy and educating people about healthy and sustainable food resources.

Since 1979, no other local nonprofit organization has fed more hungry people in Western Washington. Our efficient, effective and innovative approaches to the systemic problem of hunger make a real difference — not just for hungry people but for everyone who lives here. When children, adults and seniors have enough food to eat, they are more attentive learners, more productive employees and more engaged citizens.

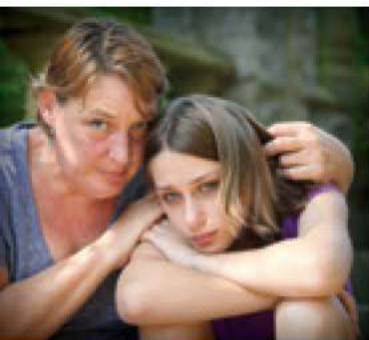
Today, Food Lifeline has launched an historic initiative to transform the way our community approaches hunger relief. With the support of our generous community, the **Ending Hunger, Feeding Hope Campaign** will raise \$20 million to build a new **Hunger Relief Solution Center** that will advance our vision of an end to hunger in Western Washington by ensuring that every man, woman and child has access to three healthy meals a day.



TOGETHER, WE CAN ENSURE THAT NO ONE GOES TO BED HUNGRY IN WESTERN WASHINGTON

An estimated 40 percent of food produced in America goes to waste — enough to feed every hungry person in the nation twice over. Food Lifeline steps in to ensure that millions of pounds of otherwise wasted local food makes it to the plates of more than 750,000 people each year. We collect nutritious food from restaurants, grocery stores, farmers and manufacturers and deliver it to more than 300 food banks, emergency shelters and meal programs across Western Washington.

THE NEED IS GROWING

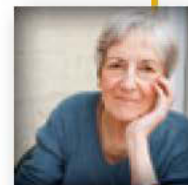

Two leased buildings in Sodo and Shoreline running at full capacity	One centrally located comprehensive center
75,000 square feet of warehouse, cold storage and office space	150,000 square feet of industry grade warehouse and cold storage space along with offices and conference rooms
Ability to collect and distribute 35 million pounds of food a year and feed 750,000 people	Ability to collect and distribute as much as 100 million pounds of food a year and feed every hungry person in Western Washington
Accommodation for 9,000 volunteers each year	Accommodation for 20,000 volunteers each year — the equivalent of 40 full-time staff members
A five-month waiting list to volunteer	A volunteer training center and expanded volunteer repack facilities that will allow us to engage thousands more community members in ending hunger
